Minutes of the Ivinghoe Parish Council Meeting held at Ivinghoe Town Hall on Monday 1st July 2024 at 7.00pm.

C/088/24 Chairman's Welcome.

The Chairman welcomed everyone to the meeting.

C/089/24 To receive questions from members of the public and press.

A resident mentioned the length of the grass on the verges in Ivinghoe, this has been reported to Buckinghamshire Council. The Councillors complained to Councillor Brazier about the length of the verges encroaching onto the pavements and overgrown hedges in the parish.

A resident asked why the traffic calming was not installed, the Chairman explained the problem with lack of funding from Buckinghamshire Council, as stated in earlier meetings.

A resident asked when the Ivinghoe Freight Strategy Zone will be enforced, Councillor Brazier stated this is expected to start in the autumn.

Apologies were received and accepted from Councillor Ketteridge.

Councillor Town submitted a report prior to the meeting. Councillor Brazier reported the new speed humps on the recently resurfaced Tring/Church Road have caused complaints from residents.

The SANGS (Suitable Alternative Natural Greenspace) are starting to be identified in Buckinghamshire with a significant one in Kingsbrook which will create a new RSPB nature reserve. It is expected that £18million will be raised from developments towards SANGs. Smaller developments of nine properties or less will incur a payment towards the SANGS of £566 per dwelling.
